

#### **Discussion Points:**

- It was presented that the new new Aged Care Act was focusing on aged care residents and recipients, rather than service providers.
- It was noted that the new Aged Care Code of Conduct was introduced by Australian Government 1 December 2022 to ensure quality, safe service delivery.
- It was noted that a new set of Aged Care Quality Standards will be introduced in late 2023.
- It was noted that the new Support at Home Program will be implemented form 1 July
- Mervyn Levine noted there is now identified training for First Nations people to be carers in their own communities.
- It was discussed by the committee that many aged care recipients are having difficulty navigating the Aged Care system and access to seek support.

Discussion points:

- It was presented to the committee that Council's Reflect Reconciliation Action Plan was nearing completion and that the new framework for the Innovate Reconciliation Action Plan is scheduled to be developed by June 2024.
- It was also presented to the Committee that Council had resolved to support the Uluru Statement from the Heart and Voice to Parliament on 27 March, 2023 with the referendum to be held on the 14 October, 2023.
- Ruark Lewis asked if Council would be creating dual naming for key Woollahra Council
   Sites and noted New Zealand cosmopolitan approach as a good example of dual naming
- Councillor Robertson noted he had raised dual naming as a notice of motion at previous Council meeting but was not supported at the time.
- Councillor Robertson noted he wants to put dual signage back on Councils agenda as an important step in recognising our First Nations people and their long connection to Country.

**Report:** future capital works projects for Council

THAT the update on Council's Capital Works programs for Inclusion (Disability, Aged & Carers) Advisory Committee be revived and noted.

#### **Discussion Points:**

- Open Space and Recreation Planning Team Leader gave an update on Trumper Park
  Pathway upgrade noting standards were set in designs but not carried out by contractor
  when installed. This was in the process of being modified to meet standards.
- Open Space and Recreation Planning Team Leader thanked Mervyn Levine on bringing the pathway defect to Council's attention.
- Open Space and Recreation Planning Team Leader noted that new binoculars will be installed at Christison Park and will send details of proposed sites and binocular specifications to Inclusion Advisor Committee for review. One of those binoculars will be inclusive and accessible to people in wheelchairs.
- Mervyn Levine also noted the difficulty for less mobile people to access Bondi Pavilion.
   Council Staff to speak with Waverley Council representatives regarding the matter.
- Council staff advised that any future projects that fall in between Committee meetings will be circulated to the Inclusion Advisory Committee for comment and advice. Inclusion Advisory Committee will be responsible to review and report back prior to meeting where needed.
