Important information regarding traffic management and local vantage points on New Year's Eve

Dear Residents,

In advance of New Year's Eve, we want to inform you of local road closures, special event clearways and vantage point information so you have time to plan ahead.

Please note at the direction of the NSW Police Service, the special event clearway changes for New Beach Road Darling Point will be in place from 8am 31 December 2024 to 2am 1 January 2025. No vehicles are to park along a clearway.

NSW Police, authorised traffic controllers and security guards will be managing road closures, clearways, vantage points, Alcohol Free Zones and Alcohol Prohibited Areas in cooperation with Woollahra Council. Police may restrict vehicle access along closed roads as required and in the interest of pedestrian and public safety. For public transport information visit www.transportnsw.info or call 131 500.

Special Event Clearways: 8am 31 December 2024 to 2am 1 January 2025

New Beach Rd	From New South Head Rd to the northern end of Yarranabbe Park – western side
New Beach Rd	From the northern end of Yarranabbe Park to Yarranabbe Road – eastern side
Thornton St	Between Darling Point Rd and Yarranabbe Rd – both sides

Special Event Clearways: 2pm 31 December 2024 to 2am 1 January 2025

New South Head Rd	Between Neild Ave and 286 New South Head Rd (start of parking bay) – northern side

Clearways are no parking zones for residents, permit holders and visitors. Parked vehicles will be towed, and a fee will be applied. To relocate a towed vehicle, call 132 701.

Road Closures: 3pm 31 December 2024 to 2am 1 January 2025

New Beach Rd	Between New South Head Rd and the end of the Road
Loftus Rd	Between Darling Point Rd and New Beach Rd

Vehicle access between **3pm and 6pm** will be available for residents only, but this access is strictly at the discretion of the Police or authorised traffic controllers.

No vehicle access is permitted to anyone between **6pm and 2am**.

Mona Ln	Between Mona Rd and end of road
Oswald St	North of New South Head Rd until end of the road
Yarranabbe Rd	Between New Beach Rd and Darling Point Rd
Thornton St	Between Darling Point Rd and Yarranabbe Rd

No vehicle access is permitted to anyone between **6pm and 2am**.

Alcohol Prohibited Areas within Woollahra:

12.01am on 31 December 2024 to 12 Midday on 1 January 2025

McKell Park, Rushcutters Bay Park, Yarranabbe Park (Darling Point), Duff Reserve (Point Piper), Murray Rose Pool and Blackburn Gardens (Double Bay), Dumaresq Reserve, Percival Park, Lyne Park, Rose Bay Foreshore and Tingira Memorial Park (Rose Bay), Parsley Bay Reserve and Christison Park (Vaucluse), and Robertson Park (Watsons Bay).

Glassware is not permitted in public parks and reserves.

Alcohol Free Zones:

From 12.01am on 31 December 2024 to 12 midday on 1 January 2025.

Alcohol Free Zones (AFZ) will be in force on the streets and footpaths of Darling Point. Visit Council's website www.woollahra.nsw.gov.au/nye for more information on AFZ locations.

Local Vantage Points:

McKell Park and Yarranabbe Park are managed sites and Alcohol Prohibited Areas. Gates open at midday at McKell Park and Yarranabbe Park. These sites will be closed once they reach capacity. For more detailed information on all of our local vantage points please visit www.woollahra.nsw.gov.au/nye

NSW Police will be out in force this New Year's Eve to reduce crime and violence and to ensure everyone in New South Wales can enjoy the New Year's Eve celebrations in a safe and secure environment.

- Do not drink alcohol in the designated Alcohol Free Zones (AFZ) or Alcohol Prohibited Areas (APA). Police can confiscate alcohol and can issue on-the-spot fines to anyone breaching this requirement.
